President & CEO

For nearly $7\frac{1}{2}$ years, Denbeck has overseen the day-to-day operations and the strategic vision of Partnership 4 Kids, a mentoring and college bound program that serves low income students from pre-kindergarten to and through postsecondary. Today, the organization serves close to 6,000 students in five levels of programming.

Commonly known as P4K, Partnership 4 Kids is the merger of two youth serving organizations: All Our Kids and The Winners Circle. These organizations came together to create and ensure a continuum of service that begins during the early years of elementary through postsecondary education.

- In 1989, Gail and Mike Yanney, started Yanney's Kids, later to be called All Our Kids. The Principal at McMillian Middle School selected twenty-five 7th grade students for the original class. These were students with similar backgrounds: had grown up in poverty, displayed potential, but for many reasons were performing at a lower academic level. The students met regularly, each received a mentor, and every student was promised a college scholarship providing they stayed out of trouble and graduated from high school. Today, that first class is excelling in their careers and many have achieved several advanced degrees.
- Jerry and Cookie Hoberman, local business people in North Omaha, wanted to give back to the community. As a result, they founded The Winners Circle at Belvedere Elementary in 1996. This program was incentive-based to help increase self-confidence through goal setting in academics and life skills.
- Mary and Dick Holland served as a defining common thread within both organizations, believing that every young person was the future of our community and our state, and their environment did not have to define them. And in 2007, the two joined forces and became P4K.

Today, P4K, serves students in 22 Omaha Public Schools: 12 elementary schools, 5 middle schools, and 5 high schools. After high school graduation, these young people are attending several postsecondary institutions within the state of Nebraska and are preparing to enter the work force.

Under Denbeck's leadership, the program has grown the number of students served by increasing the number of schools. At each level, clear measurements are set along within a curriculum that deepens and includes life skills, career exploration activities, community service, finance, academics, and college visits. Students begin experiencing postsecondary education as early as 4th grade. The program is designed so students have support from a mentor and a caring P4K program coordinator, and both are critical to the student's success. With this type of instruction and guidance students become proactive in building their future plans. The model also collaborates with similar college access programs in grades 11 and 12 for programming so there is no duplication of service. The largest investment and growth of the program has been at the college level.

Each P4K student who graduates from high school and completes all the program requirements can apply for a scholarship through the endowment. These students receive extensive programming and case management with offices at UNO and MCC (Metropolitan Community College).

Students are succeeding at every level through P4K; they are attending more days of school and achieving higher GPA's than those not involved in the program. P4K also boasts a 98% high school graduation rate with over 91% pursuing postsecondary education.

Prior to accepting the reins at P4K, Deb Denbeck spent 30 years working in higher education; twenty-one of those years as a collegiate volleyball and softball coach at College of Saint Mary and volleyball coach and Associate Athletic Director at Southwest MN State University in Marshall, MN. Denbeck returned to Nebraska in 2003 and served as the Associate Athletic Director at the University of Nebraska at Omaha, directed the UNO Women's Walk, and then went on to serve as the Director of Philanthropy at Creighton University working with both Creighton Athletics and the School of Dentistry.

Denbeck also serves as a P4K mentor. In her free time, she enjoys spending time with family, playing golf, and gardening. An avid sports enthusiast, Denbeck enjoys attending sporting events at both Nebraska and Creighton, commonly known as a "Jaysker."


